












ALL SAINTS CAROL SERVICE 2025 SUNDAY 21ST DECEMBER AT 6:30PM

'let your light shine'

Matthew 5:16 Sermon on the Mount

We are blessed to have so much talent in our school family. In line with our school vision, children are encouraged to share their gifts and shine brightly in every way.

On Monday morning this week, we were treated to a very special performance from a year five pupil who shared with us Bharatanatyam.

Bharatanatyam is one of India's oldest and most beautiful classical dance forms which is over two thousand years old It originated in the temples of South India and has been passed down through generations.

This dance form is like telling stories with your whole body and Ruhanni demonstrated to us how the hand gestures have special meanings and how the footwork, enhanced by ankle bells called ghungroos, creates rhythmic patterns which match the music.

We are so fortunate that our school family comprises of so many languages, cultures and talented children!
