










# NEWS FROM HOOLE CHURCH OF ENGLAND PRIMARY SCHOOL

'let your light shine'

Matthew 5:16 Sermon on the Mount

Our school hall was recently transformed into a theatre for a very special performance!

Artists from the Storyhouse in Chester visited our school to present a magical version on William Shakespeare's 'The Tempest.'

Children were told the story of the play prior to the visit so they were able to follow the action with ease. Pupils have already encountered many Shakespearean plays following performances by our Shakespeare Club.

Last year, players from our Shakespeare Club performed the tragedy, Romeo and Juliet. This year, due to the popularity of the first club, we ran two clubs! One club performed another tragedy 'Hamlet' whilst the second club took on the comedy 'Much Ado About Nothing.' The children who performed 'Romeo and Juliet' were also treated to a performance of 'A Midsummer Night's Dream' in Grosvenor Park, thanks to the kindness of members of our church family who supported this trip. Those children still talk about it to this day!

Seeing a professional performance of 'The Tempest' was a real treat which pupils from Year one to six enjoyed.

We believe that it is important to make pupils aware of significant British cultural figures. As children build up a bank of knowledge about Shakespeare and his works, we feel that this builds confidence to support them in the next stage of their education and many will encounter William Shakespeare in secondary school.

It is wonderful to see their enthusiasm for the plays. We were delighted by how they responded so positively to the performance. The actors left a comment in our school Visitors' Book indicating that they were impressed by the children's behaviour and their engagement throughout the show.

## Other News

### **COMMUNITY PROJECT**

Most of you will know that Jim and I live at the south end of Vicarage Road. We had moved during the second lockdown and missed the community spirit of our previous street. Last Christmas, as not-the-newcomers, and after being challenged by our Community study material about our mission to people around us, we decided to invite our neighbours to mince pies and mulled wine in our front 'garden'. We had a great evening with 26 people coming along and as a result of that, we set up a WhatsApp group.



The next step in building our community was to create our 3 Joint Alleys Community Gardens project (our postcode is 3JA!) in the alleys behind our terraced houses, for any residents who would like to grow flowers and vegetables or simply come and join in with the chatter and a cup of tea. I am now part of a Steering Group with 3 other neighbours and together we have been looking at the possibilities in the alleys. It became obvious that we needed to find funding to purchase large high level planters on wheels, so they can be moved if access is required to the alley. We are delighted that we have been accepted by the Cooperative Local Community Fund as one of 3 Chester based projects for this coming year!

The Co-op say: "We are letting you know that, as from today, Co-op Members can officially support Hoole 3 Joint Alleys (3JA) Community Gardens (Cause ID: 91528). The more members that choose your cause, the more money our project will receive.

The funding period will run until next year, closing on 18 October 2025. Your cause will receive two payments, one set payment in Spring 2025 of £500 to help you get your project off the ground, and your final grant will be issued in November next year which will be based on the number of members that have chosen your cause throughout the funding phase."

So we are asking for help from the church family, your family, friends and neighbours, to vote for us via the Co-op app or on their website. The easiest way is to download the app, and click on the link "Choose a local cause".

### A note for the Church family newsletter, regarding the Independent review of Soul Survivor Church, Watford.

The outcome of the independent review into the culture and practices of Soul Survivor was published on 26th Sept 24. A review was commissioned by Soul Survivor and led by Fiona Scolding KC, following the National Safeguarding Teams investigation into Mike Pilavachi. There are responses available in the media from church organisations and lawyers representing those affected. All Saints' takes the issues raised very seriously and will be considering its response over the next few months.
