

# Chester Diocesan Learning Trust

We have entered an exciting new chapter in the life of our school. On 1 st November, Hoole Church of England Primary School converted to an academy with Chester Diocesan Learning Trust (CDLT).

The Chester Diocesan Learning Trust is a brand-new Multi-Academy Trust (MAT) founded by our school in collaboration with seven other strong and successful church schools across Cheshire and Wirral, and the Chester Diocesan Board of Education.

The vision for the Trust is founded on Paul's letter to the Corinthians; where he talked about unity in diversity. Celebrating the unique talents and skills of each child, staff member, leader, governor and community member, CDLT is coming together to create one body with one ambition: to empower adults and children to grow, shaping a better future for all.

With collaboration, mutual respect and partnership at its heart, extensive work has been undertaken over the last year or so to create a strong foundation for the Trust. We have worked together to shape the Trust's vision and values to reflect those of the founding schools, recognising each unique context whilst sharing common values.

There are many exciting plans to enrich opportunities and experiences for pupils and adults in all of the schools involved in this Trust. We strongly believe that we will benefit from the strength of support and expertise across the Trust, as well as sharing the many strengths within our school family whilst still retaining everything that is special and unique about our school.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Sue Noakes, Deputy Director of Education for Chester Diocese for her work in the development of the CDLT Trust. Thank you also to governors, including Julie Tynegate and Craig Gaudion, and Jeff Turnbull and the Blue Coat Trustees for their wisdom and support for our school family and our community.

Thank you for your prayers and good wishes for our school family as we settle into this new phase in the history of our school.
