

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Thank you very much to those who responded to our recent email asking for some support whilst Andy Warren is on sick leave. If you missed the email or didn't get round to replying, we'd still love to hear from you even if you are only able to help as a one-off.

- Mondays and Wednesdays - The floors in Eagle and the main hall need to be cleaned (floor cleaner available). This can be done between 1pm and 2pm on a Monday and 10am-12noon on a Wednesday.
- Light cleaning which will involve vacuuming, dusting, glass cleaning.
- Deep cleaning of the kitchen. Time to be arranged with Christina.
- Opening up of the centre - There may be the odd occasion where we will need someone to open up for a group in an evening or on a weekend.
