

Jim Ellis writes:-



I have recently been appointed as a volunteer Waterways Chaplain. In fact, a probationary appointment, while I undergo training and learn the ropes. No, I hadn't heard about the Waterways Chaplaincy either, until Helen & I bumped into one of the chaplains when we were on our narrowboat last September, which inspired me to find out about it.

The Waterways Chaplaincy exists to provide a listening ear, pastoral care and support to all those who use and live on the UK waterways, the chaplains being there for people of all faiths and none, whether they be boaters, cyclists, walkers, joggers, anglers, canal workers, people whose businesses or homes are next to the waterways, in fact anyone who might be on or near the waterways for any reason.

Just as there are all manner of issues in our housing estates, so there are in our boating communities, together with some particular issues faced by live-aboard boaters, including lack of access to medical and other facilities, in addition to isolation. Sometimes just having someone prepared to listen can make all the difference. Sometimes practical help can be given. Sometimes people need to be supported in whatever situation they find themselves. Sometimes people may want to talk about faith. The Chaplains have found that the pandemic has dramatically increased the number of conversations that have taken place and requests for assistance that have been received.

We are blessed in Chester with having the Shropshire Union canal on our doorstep and my brief is to wander up and down the canal towpath once a week and see what happens. My 'patch' is anywhere from Tower Wharf in the City out to Christleton and the Cheshire Cat, with Hoole Lane lock being a good starting point as it is only a ten minute walk from home. The bicycle helps if I decide to start the walk elsewhere!

I've so far done five towpath walks and had some fascinating conversations, my favourite being with the live-aboard boater who accepted a New Testament from me, at his friend's request ('because he keeps borrowing mine!') and then insisted on buying me a beer. What's not to like?

I'm both challenged and excited by this new venture and please will you pray for me as I walk the towpath, not knowing what I may find on any given day and hoping that I may be able to show a little of God's love and care to people who might need it. The chaplains are all volunteers from local churches, so as well as representing the Chaplaincy I will be representing All Saints, which I hope to do with your blessing.

I'll put some Chaplaincy leaflets in church so you can find out more if you wish to, but please find me and talk about it if you would like to, or even join me on a walk....
