The other half is being sent to the 'poor fund' at the hospital in Manditsara where Cathy sees how this helps families in need of food and clothing as well helping with funding long term medication and hospital bills.

It reminds us that we have had quite a journey in that time. Of course, all churches have had to cope with the pandemic, but we have had an interregnum as well. We wanted to take an opportunity to say thank you to everyone who has had to adapt to the changing circumstances and to those to whom the responsibility fell to manage on our behalf through these unpredictable times.

It's been great to see people stepping out in service to the Lord and the church using the gifts that God has given them and equipped them with. Some will feel that they were just carrying out the role that had been given to them for the church, but the rest of us feel very grateful for what they have done.

We would like to say thank you to all who have served in different and sometimes unexpected ways during these months as well as everyone who has kept the church going through these difficult and uncertain times. We are not going to identify people as we are bound to leave someone out, but we would like to remind us all of the challenges that have been overcome.

If we take ourselves back to March 2020, all of a sudden we could not go to church services, so they had to be put together and broadcast online. And since then, we have had them adapt to being broadcast live and sometimes including recorded material as well. So, we would like to thank the technical team who adapted to several new ways of ensuring the services reached us in one form or another. Also, to all those involved in leading and taking part in the services, from defining the programme and structure, to leading, preaching, worshipping in music etc from their homes (involving more technical accomplishment) and then gradually returning to church. Also, in managing the risks associated with worshipping together as we emerged from lockdown, including the welcomers who have been looking after and cleaning after us.

We'd like to thank the church staff, who had to adapt to furlough and changes in their roles at different times in the pandemic and served us all in so many different ways.

We'd like to thank all those involved in the children and families work in this time when the pressure on parents has been extreme – it's lovely to see the children coming back with their enthusiasm and cheer.

Homegroups and other pastoral care have been a lifeline for us all – the number of different, creative ways that we have managed to come together and be cared for is amazing. Also, we know that there have been individual acts of care that have meant a lot to those who are more vulnerable, both those in the congregation and those who are neighbours or in the community.

We also want to thank all who have so faithfully prayed for all aspects of the mission, the ministry and the future of All Saints throughout the interregnum and the covid lockdowns. This is a largely unseen but is such a vital ministry as we are reminded in James 5:16 *"The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective."*

In the interregnum, the leadership has had to take on more responsibility including Standing Committee, the Leadership team and the PCC – including the process of finding our new vicar, Craig.

As ever, we are bound to have left people out of this list. But everyone likes to be thanked in some way or other. If you know someone who has helped you or you know has helped others do thank them – they will appreciate that you have understood their service and be encouraged.


