"We are delighted that we have had very many excellent applications for the post. We have been prayerfully considering each one and by the time you read this, we expect that a shortlist of candidates will have been drawn up.

The selected candidates will be invited for the 2 day interview process on Monday 17th and Tuesday 18th May. They will have the chance to view the church and centre, hopefully seeing some of the activities which will be taking place. They will also have guided tours of the Parish and Hoole Primary School.

The candidates will also meet with the Staff and Leadership teams, and representatives of the PCC, Worship and Preaching teams and Children and Youth workers. This will be an opportunity for the candidates to find out more about us and ask the questions they want to know about. At the moment we think this will probably take place over Zoom.

We really value your prayers for the organisation of the visits and most of all for the selection of God's candidate for our Parish. This is an exciting and challenging task as we look to discern who will lead us forward in God's work in Hoole"
