
Church School Governors

Hoole Church of England Primary School



As I sit here, I can hardly believe another school year is coming to a close. It has been a rollercoaster of a year with twists and turns that we did not anticipate last September. We started the year with a real sense of optimism after the disruption of the previous year. During the autumn term, we built up a head of steam and dared to dream that we could look forward to some sense of what we previously knew as normal slowly returning. We finished for Christmas with a real feeling of relief that we had managed to avoid a wave of positive cases within our school family. As the Christmas holidays progressed and anxiety began to grow and to our dismay, schools were forced to close again in January. Over the spring term, we once again rode a wave of uncertainty and our school family responded with resilience and fortitude to a further period of remote learning. When pupils returned on the 8th March, we hoped that the rest of the year would be settled so we could power full steam ahead. Just as we were approaching the end of this year with our plans for celebrations and special events, we experienced a spike in cases and faced the biggest challenge we have had since the pandemic began.

However, despite all of this, children have astounded us with the response they have shown to the challenges we have faced. The manner in which pupils have adapted and adjusted to new ways of working is an inspiration to us all. There is a lot of talk in the media about a generation lost to the pandemic but our school family has responded demonstrating the resilience, perseverance and endurance that we promote as often as we can. Our pupils are quite simply, the beacons of love, compassion, good humour and determination which illuminate our school every single day.

In the midst of the end of term activities, we also continue to participate in other community events with our Tatton garden being built as I write! Our school garden at Tatton is so special because the hands, ideas and dedication of pupils are invested into every inch of our plot. Children have been instrumental in designing, growing and creating the sculptures for the garden. We have not simply purchased plants and put them together – they have been planned and grown by children from seedlings and cuttings. What a wonderful opportunity to show patience, to care for creation and to celebrate the beauty of the natural world created by God's mighty hand!
