

Hoole Church of England Primary School

Our worship sessions focus on linking scripture and stories of courage, perseverance or determination in order to equip our children to enjoy life in all its fullness and let their lights shine brightly in all they do.



Last Friday, pupils in Years four, five and six had the opportunity to listen to an inspirational speaker to illuminate their knowledge of the Apartheid in South Africa in conjunction with recent worships sessions about Nelson Mandela.

Pupils engaged in a powerful and inspirational meeting with Chris Lubbe, who served as a body guard for Nelson Mandela for several years. Working alongside the great leader Mandela, Mr Lubbe developed friendships with figures including Archbishop Desmond Tutu.

Mr Lubbe talked to pupils about his early experiences as a child growing up under the Apartheid regime and how this affected his family first hand.

I have spoken to children since they participated in this session with Mr Lubbe and their response has been tremendous.

Some of their reflections are recorded below:

“Everyone is equal even if you look different or do things differently.”

“I reflected that no matter who you are, everyone is equal. No matter what is your religion or the colour of your skin, you treat others like you should want to be treated.”

“Nelson Mandela was imprisoned for twenty-seven years. When he came out, he did not seek revenge. He did the bravest thing. He forgave.”

“I learnt to never be silent and to speak out. Whether you are small, tall, whatever your skin colour, we should all be treated the same way. If someone has been mean to you, forgive them, not fight them. Forgiveness is the key. It’s freedom. Never remain silent, words are important.”

Cathedral Pilgrim Porch: An opportunity for All Saints to take part

We have received an invitation from Archdeacons Mike and Ian to take part in an exciting opportunity for our church to be permanently represented in a major new feature at Chester Cathedral.



2022 is the Queen’s Platinum Jubilee year, and the installation of the new Pilgrim Porch to enhance the West Door entrance to Chester Cathedral is being planned for June, to celebrate the Jubilee. Artist Stephen Broadbent has designed a beautiful entrance that will incorporate images from every church in the diocese, etched into the glass and shaped into a labyrinth.
