Thank you for your prayers and good wishes for our school.

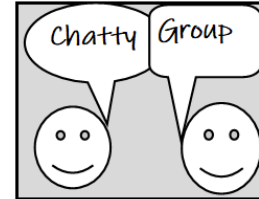

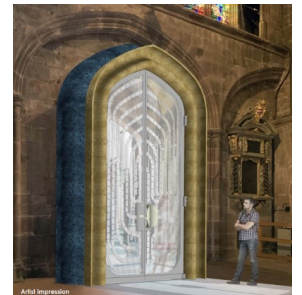

Cathedral Pilgrim Porch: An opportunity for All Saints to take part

We have received an invitation from Archdeacons Mike and Ian to take part in an exciting opportunity for our church to be permanently represented in a major new feature at Chester Cathedral.



2022 is the Queen's Platinum Jubilee year, and the installation of the new Pilgrim Porch to enhance the West Door entrance to Chester Cathedral is being planned for June, to celebrate the Jubilee. Artist Stephen Broadbent has designed a beautiful entrance that will incorporate images from every church in the diocese, etched into the glass and shaped into a labyrinth. Time is short and so they are asking us to develop our ideas as soon as we can. Images have to be with the artist before the end of February. Essentially, we need to decide on what image might be most significant and meaningful to our church. We then must provide two quality images showing the detail and context and then send them to Stephen together with some background, for an accompanying website, that explains why we have chosen the image we have.
